



They were awesome and although they didn't get through to the final, they did brilliantly and were a credit to the school - their teamwork and excitement was lovely to see. The school football team played their latest league game and maintained their unbeaten season with a 0-6 win away at Peters Hill Primary School in Stourbridge.

Over half term, another exciting T. T. Rock Stars battle took place. It was the first time year 2 have joined in a battle this year so well done to any year 2 children who took part. It will probably come as no surprise that 5W were the winners again... it seems as if they are unbeatable! As a class, they managed to score 31,332 points. In second place was 4K with 19,851 points and 6J came in third with a score of 12,363. 
The book fair and parental surveys will also be conducted on this night.

Parent Information Update

Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs)



At Netherbrook, if your child is on the <u>SEN register</u> they will have a termly <u>My Plan or My Plan+</u>. These are reviewed and, when achieved, new targets are set. Teachers get in touch with parents via Class Dojo or meet face to face to gather your views. This is the first step towards identifying significant additional needs in children. It is rare to go from no intervention straight to receiving an EHCP.

If your child is making little to no progress in school and is already on the SEN register, is significantly below age related expectations or their needs cannot be met within a set budget (the Local Authority name this as the notional budget of £6000), this is when an EHCP assessment is considered. School and the Local Authority need evidence over time to demonstrate this (including evidence of My Plans over time, assessment information, professional reports etc.)

An EHCP is a legal, personalised document for children who need more support in their educational setting beyond the usual resource they provide (this is the notional budget).

An EHCP assessment can only be undertaken if the child or young person has, or may have, special educational needs – <u>it does not apply</u> where there are only health and/or care needs, no matter how severe.

Dudley Local Authority state, "If your child's special educational needs are complex and/or severe and, despite receiving additional help through the normal graduated SEN approach, your child has not made progress, you or your child's education setting can request that the local authority (LA) complete an education, health and care needs assessment. The assessment will determine whether or not it is necessary to issue an Education Health Care Plan (EHCP).

An EHCP will be necessary where the assessment identifies that a child or young person requires access to specialist support or provision for a prolonged period of time in order to meet their special educational needs and to support them towards achieving greater independence in preparation for adulthood."

Early years settings, schools and post-16 institutions can request an assessment, acting on behalf of the child/young person, School will do this if the criteria shown above is met. .
