Measles

As you will no doubt have read in the press, cases of measles are currently rising quite rapidly in the West Midlands. Dudley schools have also been affected.

We have been told by the Dudley Public Health Team that 60% of the WM children who have contracted measles have ended up in hospital. Therefore, we have been asked to encourage all parents to ensure that your children and you have been double vaccinated against Measles using the MMR Vaccine.

When the 2 vaccines are taken a person has a 99% immunity for Measles, Mumps and Rubella. All of these are serious diseases that can be easily avoided.

If you are not sure if your child has had both vaccines then please contact your GP surgery and they can tell you. If you or your children haven't had the vaccine there are some pop up vaccination UK centres in Dudley borough over half term. There are gelatine free vaccinations also available.

I strongly advise you to check your child's status and go along to get the vaccines. Vaccines are available for <u>children</u>

AND adults who have not had two doses of the MMR vaccine.

Whilst there is no need to panic or for undue alarm, it would be very prudent to make sure that everyone in your household is fully vaccinated.

Please note that old fears about the MMR vaccine causing Autism etc have been completely debunked, however, there is a genuine and significant risk of serious harm if your child catches Measles and is unvaccinated.

Have you and your children had their MMR vaccine?

Pop up vaccination clinics have been set up across the Black Country for children aged 5 and over and adults who have missed a dose.

Measles is a highly infectious disease which can lead to serious complications such as severe lung infections and inflammation of the brain. It also damages and suppresses the whole immune system, meaning children can be left much more susceptible to catching other illnesses.

Symptoms of measles include:

- high temperature
- runny or blocked nose
- sneezing
- cough
- red, sore, watery eyes
- rash, which usually appears a few days after cold-like symptoms (sometimes it starts around the ears before spreading to the rest of the body).
